
Due to the nature of our school and the small class sizes, Ashgabat International School does not rank students. The cumulative GPA on the student's transcript only reflects courses taken at QSI. Grades from previous schools are not included in the GPA but they are listed on student transcripts.

SAT Scores

The SAT was administered to 28 students from 2018-2020. The highest score from each student, including those from non-native English speakers, are included. AIS Mean SAT score: 1100

COVID-19 Statement

Due to COVID-19, AIS has been conducting a combination of online lessons and $\frac{1}{2}$ day study sessions since March 2020. Currently, all overseas teachers are out of Turkmenistan, and not expected to be able to enter the country until January 2021 at the earliest, so study sessions are being monitored by locally hired teachers and para-professionals. During this period, students are continuing to receive a full academic course load and are expected to meet the same graduation requirements as they would if AIS were conducting full in-person learning. This has proven to be a challenge due to the instability of internet connectivity and access to websites in Turkmenistan, but both students and staff are finding creative ways to overcome this challenge. In addition, our students have had less access to SAT/SAT Subject tests because of an inability to get testing materials into Turkmenistan. To date, the SAT testing center in Turkmenistan has not been able to successfully conduct an SAT testing administration. We ask that all higher education institutions take this into account when evaluating our students' applications.











Advanced Placement Program

AIS offers onsite AP classes and online AP classes. We do not have a set limit on the number of AP classes that students can take. The means listed below are from the years 2016-2019.

Grading

Mastery of each essential unit is evaluated with an A or B (mastery grades). B denotes mastery of learning outcomes at a high level of understanding. A represents mastery where the student demonstrates higher order thinking skills. Mediocre or poor work, resulting in Cs and Ds, is not acceptable, and students will re-engage until they demonstrate mastery. Students who master a unit with a B evaluation may attempt to demonstrate a higher level of mastery at a later time, within that current school year, to change the evaluation to an A. Time periods (quarters, semesters, and terms) are not evaluated. Assessment is continuous and student performance is assessed on learning outcomes and units of study.

Graduation Requirements

The school offers three diplomas:

Academic Diploma with Honors: 24 Carnegie Units (240 QSI Unit Credits)

Requirements are the same as The Academic Diploma with the added condition that accumulated credits include at least two IB certificates or Advanced Placement (AP) courses. A total of 240 credits are required for this diploma. English (70), Science (30), Technology (10), Mathematics (30), Fine Arts (10), Wellness (10), Physical Education (10), Foreign Language (20), Cultural Studies (40), Electives (10)

Academic Diploma: 24 Carnegie Units (240 QSI Unit Credits)
